The Sustainable Living Infrastructure Consortium (SLIC) is a not for profit entity of NAHC which has an affiliation with Griffith University, Queensland, Australia.

As a not-for-profit low-income housing provider, one of the key objectives of NAHC is to further the national and international provision of sustainable and affordable living choices.

NAHC has a history of providing innovative support in sustainable living choices and is currently providing funding to support the Sustainable Built Environment National Research Centre (SBEnc), national architectural competitions in collaboration with the National Disability Insurance Scheme and various projects associated with institutional investment in sustainable and affordable living choices.

NAHC aims to continue to be a leader in the delivery of low-income housing (various tenures) and to provide the low housing sector with alternative sustainable living choices via networks, partnerships, research and policy innovation via the brokerage of SLIC under the leadership of **Professor George Earl** who has a forty year association with the sector and a PhD in real estate financing of affordable living choices and has conducted over 12 million Australian dollars of research in the sector both in Australian and overseas (over 80 publications and policy outcomes).

The aim of SLIC is to develop a network of partners, some in kind others financial, these include but not necessary restricted too:
